GREENSBORO, N.C. —Bennett College proudly presents **WHAT.** written by Kamilah Bush November 17-20, 2016 in Bennett College’s Little Theatre, located on 900 E. Washington St. Greensboro, NC. The play examines the personal side of the Black Lives Matter Movement and how it affects those left behind.

Walter Scott was stopped for a busted taillight, and was on his way somewhere – he was in the middle of something – and this thought inspired the telling of **WHAT.**
